

Piece It Together!

Materials needed:

- An easy puzzle for each group of students (You can buy these at the Dollar Tree. Make sure the puzzles are 25 pieces or less.)
- Task Cards
- Answer Keys

How to Play

- Divide your students into teams (groups of three or four).
- Have two teams face each other for a “play off”. Give each team a puzzle and the answer key for the opposite team so that they can check each other’s answers and award pieces. For example, Team A of three students is playing against team B of three students. The students on Team B have the key for Team A, and the students of Team A have the key for Team B. Team A has cards 1-25. Team B has cards 26-50. The teams can check each other and award puzzle pieces to each other when the answers are correct.
- You may let the group confer when answering or require one person from the group give the answer per turn.
- If the person in the group gets the answer correct, the other team will give that team one piece to their puzzle.
- The first team to earn all of their pieces and put their puzzle together wins!
